# Housing Authority Rental Assistance Programs

**87%** of HACSM's 5,000+ vouchers assist Extremely Low Income and formerly homeless households

Rental assistance awards over previous 12 months

- Received and leased-up **222 Emergency Housing Vouchers** for homeless households
  - Received and now leasing-up **41 Mainstream Vouchers** for homeless and at-risk households
  - **15 Foster Youth Independence Vouchers** just awarded for homeless and at-risk former foster youth
- = 278 homeless or at-risk households quickly housed**

# County Housing Voucher Program

In March 2022, the Board of Supervisors approved **\$4 million in Measure K funding** for a **new County Housing Voucher Program**.

## Program Goals:

- Keep rents deeply affordable for approximately **100 formerly homeless households**.
- Support housing retention by providing **access to intensive supportive services**.

## County Housing Voucher Program:

- Program limits rents to 30% of tenant's gross income.
- Tenants have access to on-site intensive support services free of charge.
- Ongoing 15-year program, subject to biennial Board appropriations.
- 2023 Launch


## Homelessness Dashboard
