



The Assessment Roll: Key Factors Affecting the Bottom Line








The reappraisal is part of an annual review of properties having declining value; or

Where Your Taxes Go



Property Tax Annual Calendar

December 10*	Delinquent date to pay first installment of secured tax bill. After 5 p.m., a 10 percent penalty is added.
November 30	Close of Assessment Appeals Board filing period (next business day if it falls on the weekend)
November 1	Due date to pay first installment of secured tax bill
September-October	Tax Collector issues annual secured tax bills
August 31	Last day to pay unsecured property tax payment without delinquency penalty
July 2	Appeals Board filing period opens
July 1	Fiscal year begins; secured roll done
June 30	Last day of fiscal year
May 7	Last day to file Business Property Statement without penalty
April 10*	Delinquent date to pay second installment of secured tax bill. After 5 p.m., a 10 percent penalty plus \$40.00 charge is added
April 1	Business property statement due
February 1	Second installment of secured taxes due and payable
January 1	Tax Lien Date as of which ownership and value is determined

* Other due dates may apply for supplemental and escape assessments.



San Mateo County Elections

California Voter's Choice Act



Landmark legislation: Signed into law September 29, 2016

> Fundamentally transforms elections to All-Mailed Ballot/Vote Center model with Ballot Drop Box Locations

San Mateo County was one of the first 5 counties in California to conduct elections under the VCA on June 5, 2018.

Vote by Mail

- Ballots mailed starting October 7.
- Return your ballot in the postage-paid envelope.
- Ballots must be postmarked by Election Day and received by November 15, 2022.



Ballot Drop-off Locations

• 55 locations throughout the County



Vote Centers

- In-person voting at any Vote Center in San Mateo County.
- Three Vote Centers open in North, Central, and South County starting October 11.
- A total of forty-five Vote Centers will be open Saturday, November 5 through Election Day.
- All Vote Centers will be open Election Day, November 8, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.










November Statewide General Election
