The Gender Clinic (San Mateo Medical Center) (for adults)

- What: As a specialty clinic of the San Mateo Medical Center, The Gender Clinic to partners with patients, who are experts in their own gender care needs, to provide excellent, evidence-based care, with compassion and respect, allowing patients to identify their own diverse gender identities and needs. The Gender Care team offers the following services: hormone therapy; gender affirming psychological therapy; evaluation for support letters and for gender-affirming surgery; assistance with referrals and insurance authorizations; coordination of care and support with coverage/benefits.

UCSF Child and Adolescent Gender Center (for youth)

- What: UCSF's Child and Adolescent Gender Center offers comprehensive medical and psychological care, as well as advocacy and legal support, to transgender, nonbinary and gender-expansive kids. With our program housed within the UCSF Division of Pediatric Endocrinology, we offer the most advanced medical care. If appropriate, treatment may include gonadotropin-releasing hormone agonists, medication that can safely suppress puberty by blocking production of the principal sex hormones, estrogen and testosterone. Fully reversible, this treatment gives young people time to achieve greater self-awareness of their gender identity. For other patients, if appropriate, our experts may administer gender-affirming sex hormones.

Stanford Pediatric & Adolescent Gender Clinic (for youth)

- What: This multidisciplinary clinic provides medical services for gender nonconforming youths and their families in one central location. The expert members of the Gender Clinic team consists of providers from pediatric endocrinology, adolescent medicine, pediatric urology and social services, supporting each child's or adolescent's gender identity. All our providers are members of the World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH). Services include help with social, medical and legal transitions. In addition to the core providers, adolescent gynecology, child and adolescent psychiatry, primary care and fertility preservation providers are available in close proximity to the Gender Clinic.

MENTAL HEALTH

San Mateo County Pride Center (for all ages)

- What: The San Mateo County Pride Center provides high quality, LGBTQ+ affirming mental health services to community members living throughout San Mateo County. Operating as a program of StarVista, the Pride Center works in partnership with Peninsula Family Service and Outlet (a program of Adolescent Counseling Services) to offer robust programs and services to support LGBTQ+ community members of all ages, with specialized programming for youth and older adults. The Pride Center offers education, training, community events, peer support groups, daily programming, clinical therapy, and case management. Clinical services include individual therapy, relationship therapy, family therapy, group therapy, and support with finding housing, job search, navigating resources, and more.

Peninsula Family Service – LGBTQ Senior Peer Counseling (for adults aged 55+)

- What: Navigating our advancing years can be challenging, even for those with a strong support network. Now, imagine crossing those same waters alone, without friends or family to turn to for support. Our Peer Counseling program works to ensure no one faces the challenges of aging alone. Specially-trained volunteer counselors provide weekly visits to adults age 55+ to help manage transitions and life changes such as health concerns, mobility issues, caregiver needs, and grief. Special care is taken to connect participants with someone who shares similar life-experiences and perspectives, with programs offered in languages such as English, Mandarin, Spanish, and Tagalog, and to participants who identify as LGBTQIA+.
- <u>Where</u>: Individual peer counseling sessions take place weekly over the phone or a zoom conference call. Group sessions are offered in a variety of languages in Daly City, San Mateo, Redwood City, and the Coastside (In-person sessions will resume at a later time).
- How to access: Our Peer Counseling program is open to adults age 55+ who live in San Mateo
 County. After applying, participants are matched with a volunteer Peer Counselor who often
 shares a similar background, native language, and life experiences. Participants can choose to
 join a group session or request one-on-one counseling.

HIP Housing - Home Sharing Program (for adults)

What: HIP Housing empowers families and individuals in San Mateo County to live happier, more
independent, and self-sufficient lives through innovative housing and mentoring programs that
help break the cycle of poverty and end homelessness. HIP Housing's Home Sharing Program
matches home-seekers with home-providers. Home Sharing program includes: Interviewing and

New Haven Inn (for adults)

- What: NHI is an emergency shelter for LGBTQ+ adults. LifeMoves works with clients to transition them to stable housing. The length of stay is approx. 90 days. NHI provides intensive case management to clients. NHI is an all-gender facility: no part of the facility, including the beds, is separated by gender. All basic necessities are provided to clients. Laundry, showers, hygiene supplies, linens, clothing, are available on site. NHI is a sober environment which provides support surrounding trauma, mental illness and substance abuse as part of daily programming.

Our Trans Home SF – Bobbi Jean Baker House and Rental Subsidy Program (for adults)

• What: The Bobbi Jean Baker House is an independent living house in the Mission District of San Francisco for transgender, non-binary, gender non-conforming, and intersex individuals experiencing homelessness in the Bay Area, CA with integrated housing case management. Eligibility is determined based on income, current housing situation, willingness to engage in a structured housing case management program, and availability of rooms in the house. The Rental Subsidy Program is a financial assistance program for transgender and non-binary, gender non-conforming and intersex individuals residing in the Bay Area, CA who are at risk of homelessness. Eligibility is determined based on income, rent price, and availability of program funds. If enrolled, income will be verified every three months to determine continued eligibility. The amount of subsidy awarded depends on income and will decrease over time to allow for the program to reach the largest number of those in need.

- What: The Transgender District's Housing Opportunities for Trans Tenants (H.O.T.T.) Program is a housing subsidy program whose main goal is to provide equitable, stable, gender affirming and permanent housing opportunities for transgender, gender non-conforming, non-binary, and intersex individuals throughout the Bay Area. HOTT highlights The Transgender District's various program initiatives, which include Tenant Protections, Economic and Workforce Development, Arts and Culture, Culture and Heritage Preservation, Cultural Competency, Land Use, and Trans Empowerment. The program is a partnership with local developer, Starcity. Starcity is a lifestyle brand which provides beautifully designed co-living communities in San Francisco, Oakland, Los Angeles, and Barcelona.

Free Virtual Monthly Legal Name and Gender Change Workshop (for all ages)

- What: The San Mateo County Pride Center hosts a FREE monthly Legal Name and Gender Change Workshop for all ages. Workshops are typically held through Zoom the last Wednesday of each month, but subject to change around the holidays so please check the calendar. Meetings are led by our Lead Case Manager, Alex Golding. Together we will review and complete the necessary paperwork for you (or your parents) to file with your local courthouse to legally change your name and/or gender marker.
