undergrounding, and sanitary sewer replacement
 Project progress completed includes 95% of sanitary sewer work, 100%
of new underground storm drainpipes, 73% of joint trench work, and
25% of surface improvements
Remaining project items include underground work, lane
 reconfiguration, sidewalk construction, road reconstruction, streetlights, installment of railroad crossing equipment, PG&E and other utilities, public Wi-Fi installation, and energize underground system DPW working with other agencies involved to complete project as fast as possible by meeting daily to address issues and adding additional staff Updates shared with community members within proximity to the project area using a variety of communication channels OCA Business Analyst offers office hours on-site to answer any questions, provide information or collect feedback from the community Feedback from businesses include parking concerns, decrease in sales, fear of displacement, and concern for duration of project

6. Report Out

Supervisor's Report, presented by Maggie Cornejo, Legislative Aid

- \$17 million in funds have been secured for an affordable housing project behind the Fair Oaks Clinic on the Middlefield junction. The construction for this project will begin in April 2023, it will include 179 units and a childcare center.
- The Healthy Community Mural Project collected over 200 survey responses, there will be a community meeting on November 29th to finalize the project topics. The HCMP committee received 16 application proposals for the 16 murals, more information will be provided soon.

County Executive's Report, presented by Justin Mates, Deputy County Executive

• The Board of Supervisors approved \$2.5 million in allocation ARPA funds and in addition the county accepted \$500,000 from CZI for the new North Fair Oaks Economic Advancement Center. County Legal and Purchasing teams are working together to determine the provider that will be on site. County looking for a designated location for this center; the goal is to have the center operating within the first quarter of 2023.
