Community development activities

- Funding sources: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Federal/State Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) and State Permanent Local Housing Allocation (PLHA)
- Estimated funding amount: \$2,111,824
- <u>Renewals only</u>: 2nd year of a 2-year grant cycle / <u>Renewal applications must</u> be submitted.

Capital activities – Housing Development & Public Facilities Development and/or Improvement

- Funding sources: CDBG and Home Investment Partnerships (HOME)
- Estimated funding amount: \$3,746,503.68
- Open to new applicants

Applications due: January 12, 2023 by 5:00 p.m.

Award decisions finalized in April 2023 Grant period: July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024

Funding Priorities

Capital activities – Housing Development & Public Facilities Development and/or Improvement

Housing Development/Housing Repair and Modification Programs

- Development of new housing, acquisition/rehabilitation of existing housing, conversion of non-housing structures to provide affordable housing, permanent supportive housing, or transitional housing
- Target population: Extremely Low- and Very Low-Income households/persons with special needs.
 Note: At least 50% of the Housing Development allocation will be targeted to projects providing permanent supportive housing units for special needs populations.

Rehabilitation of rent-restricted, existing multi-family affordable housing.

Housing repair and modification programs

 Programs operated by nonprofit agencies that provide cost-effective improvements focusing on health & safety, housing quality standards, and/or access modifications.

Funding Cycle

Two-year funding cycle for Public Service grantees.

Grantees that are approved for grant funding this first year will need to submit a renewal application the second year.
 Staff and the Subcommittee will review the renewal applications and determine funding allocations.

- Review applications
- Needs Assessment Hearing
- Finalize allocations and adopt Annual Action Plan

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

- Public Services
- Minor Home Repair
- Economic Development
- Fair Housing
- <u>Returning applicants do not</u> <u>need to apply – only hit "Renew</u> <u>Application"</u>

Permanent Local Housing Allocation (PLHA)

- Predevelopment, development, acquisition, rehabilitation, and preservation of affordable multifamily, rental housing including necessary operating subsidies.
- Assistance to persons who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness: providing rapid rehousing, rental assistance, supportive/case management services that allow people to obtain and retain housing, operating and capital costs for navigation centers and emergency shelters, and the new construction, rehabilitation, and preservation of permanent and transitional housing.
