On March 17, 2020, the Governor issued Executive Order N-29-20 suspending certain provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act (Brown Act) in order to allow for local legislative bodies to conduct their meetings telephonically or by other electronic means. On September 16, 2021, the Governor signed AB 361, a bill that formalizes and modifies the teleconference procedures implemented by California public agencies in response to the Governor's Executive Orders addressing Brown Act compliance during shelter-in-place periods. AB 361 allows local governments to continue to conduct virtual meetings as long as there is a gubernatorially-proclaimed public emergency in combination with adopted findings that meeting in person would present risks to health. Thus, pursuant to AB 361 the public Study Session meetings of the North Fair Oaks Community Council will continue to be conducted exclusively via Zoom.

*Instructions for Public Comment during Teleconference Meetings

During teleconference meetings of the North Fair Oaks Community Council, members of the public may address the Members of the Council as follows:

*Written Comments:

Written public comments may be emailed in advance of the meeting. Please read the following instructions carefully:

- 1. Your written comment should be emailed to <u>communityaffairs@smcgov.org</u>.
- 2. Your email should include the specific agenda item on which you are commenting.
- 3. Members of the public are limited to one comment per agenda item.
- 4. The length of the emailed comment should be commensurate with the two minutes customarily allowed for verbal comments, which is approximately 250-300 words.
- 5. If your emailed comment is received by 5:00 p.m. on the day before the meeting, it will be provided to the Members of the Council. The Clerk will make every effort to read

emails received after that time but cannot guarantee such emails will be read during the meeting, although such emails will still be included in the administrative record.

Spoken public comments will be accepted during the meeting through Zoom. Please read the following instructions carefully:
