2. Public Comment

Anna Kramer – Kramer is a longtime North Fair Oaks resident who is the Congressional candidate for district 15, which NFO is in. She is hopeful that she will represent NFO because this is home to her.

Jose Moreno – Owner of the 2865 Middlefield Road Laundry Mat. His concerns are about the removal of the four parking stalls in front of his business, along the bus stop in front of his business. It's been causing some issues with his business and has been affecting his business too. He's asking to for help and to reconsider the bust stop.

Raul Maldonado – Owner of Al's Autobody. Expressed how there was no awareness to him as well as other businesses in the area about the bus stop being moved and their parking being removed too. Business for him has been difficult lately due to the lack of parking and open space in front his shop. He also expressed concerns of the influence of the bench being there as well for the bus stop. It's been causing lots of issues for him and his customers.

Off Street Parking Exception to allow two uncovered spaces where two covered spaces are required. Request for an exception to the Electrical Vehicle (EV) parking requirement Off Street Parking Exception: The number of spaces, location, and design of existing bicycle parking would adequately serve the new building. occupants. There is more than adequate space on site to provide one designated bicycle parking in compliance with the CMU 3 district. Extenuating and/or unusual circumstances exist relating to property shape or location of development that impair compliance with Section 6570.8. Due to the location of the existing buildings, there is not adequate space to construct a new two car garage or carport without obstructing existing access to the rear building's existing (commercial) garage doors. Requesting an Off-Street Parking Exception to provide two uncovered parking space located between the buildings will be as nearly in compliance with the parking regulations as reasonably possible.
