I have lived at 1150 Palomar Drive since 1978 (my spouse has lived here for a shorter period) & our home is located directly across the street from 1175 Palomar Drive. We strongly object to the operation of a wireless telecommunications facility at 1175 Palomar Drive. We do not believe that a business should be conducted in a residential area, particularly when it doesn't benefit the local residents. Furthermore, we are concerned about the possible health problems a wireless telecommunications facility can cause. We know the science is not clear on the possible health problems of telecommunications facilities, but the American Cancer Society has stated that "... this does not mean that the RF waves from cell phone towers have been proven to be absolutely safe."

There is a long & sad history of products that have caused serious health issues & death to humans, e.g., tobacco, asbestos, mercury, chromium, & the many toxins that have been released into the atmosphere & dumped into our waterways before we recognized the danger to humans, & we hope & expect that the County would use caution before allowing a telecommunications facility in the middle of a residential area.

Perhaps a more suitable place for the telecommunications facility would be in an area close to the Edgewood Road & Highway 280 intersect?

I understand there is a public hearing on Cell Tower located at 1175 Palomar Dr., RWC, on May 1st. APN: 051-416-040, File No PLN2001-00801

Sad to say, we in Palomar Park have fought this site through numerous companies for some 25 years and are still against it being on neighborhood property.

I live next door to this site (1165 Palomar Dr.) and have opposed it's existence all this time.

Years ago, we put our home up for sale and when the new buyer (**WHO WAS A DOCTOR**) saw the tower he backed out of the contract. He told us he was planning on marrying and starting a family right away and he did not want to subject his family to the radiation that comes from these towers. Also stating there have been **NO** recent studies for years on how much radiation these towers put out. Yet, the Federal Government says we have to live with it. It's time for this, **"I don't care attitude to stop"**. The people who live in this county should be able to control what they like in the neighborhoods. I'd like to see the county **turn down the** renewable use- permit for the cell tower at 1175 Palomar Dr., RWC.

Years before when we were fighting the installation expansion on this Palomar Park site, PP Homeowners showed the county there were other areas to access with the same amount of coverage, yet the county didn't even bring up the alternative sites to the companies at the time.

County just went ahead and ok'd the project. These towers have no business in neighborhoods that have small children in them.

As a compromise to closure of the site---have T-Mobile relocate the tower down the hill in front of the site. This land is still private, but belonged to the old rock quarry that was there back in the early 70's. This land now belongs to the housing development at the bottom of the hill, White Cliff Homes. Plus, the hill is bare and has no growth on it. That way the project would still face 280 for connection to the tower at 280. It just wouldn't be as obtrusive to the family living at 1175 Palomar Dr. It could be put below the hill line of the property, but tall enough to hook up with the tower at 280. I believe maybe the housing development may still be called the Paul

Patterson track at the county.

White Cliff Homes HOA now owns the hill. This relocation of the site makes more sense than having it in a neighbor's back yard where they have to deal with it on a daily basis and have never wanted it there in the first place.

Please consider this new idea to move the tower off the property of 1175 Palomar Dr and relocate it's mid point destination on the hill in front of the site. Please send someone from your office to at least to review the possibility of such a move before the hearing date. 1165 Palomar Dr and I would be happy to speak with anyone on this option.
