We are the neighbors that live across the street from 1175 Palomar Drive, Redwood City, CA

Based on the following information we are opposed to San Mateo County renewing the cell tower lease with T-mobile - Crown Castle

1. There are potential health risks to people and animals, caused by exposure to harmful radio frequency emissions.
2. Some studies have examined the possibility of a link between RF exposure and cancer. Results to date have been inconclusive. Although, it is possible that tumor formation in animals may occur when there is RF exposure under certain specific conditions.
3. Cell tower safety should be considered on a case-by-case basis, to demonstrate compliance when concerns of potential non-compliance of the transmitter or facility is brought to San Mateo County's attention.
4. San Mateo County, however, can regulate certain aspects of the design, location, and placement of those cell tower facilities.
5. Palomar Park is a residential neighborhood.
6. Possibly consider Edgewood Road, Redwood City as an alternative location for the cell tower.
7. We request that San Mateo County consider withdrawing the option to renew T-mobile's permit for the continuation of the cell tower use, and terminate the lease at 1175 Palomar Drive, Redwood City, CA.
