Blue Ribbon Month Planning (April 6-12, 2025)	• Focus on one awareness topic for the month ◦ Proposed topics: car safety, drowning, falling out of windows • Selected focus: Car Safety / Car seat safety ◦ Family Health has resources to supply car seats ◦ Stanford provides car seats to Medi-Cal patients (for patients who just delivered or have a damaged car seat from a MVC) ◦ Stanford will look to see if there is data available related to car seat safety injury ▪ County will work with the San Mateo Medical Center through Dr. Egge to see if this information is available • Potential focus later on: Preventing Child Sexual Abuse ◦ Education in this area could make a big difference
