**5. Review and Approve February 20, 2024 Regular Meeting Minutes**

## 6. **BPAC Member Announcements and Discussion** (Information)

- **Member Langbein** commented on the Route 1 bridge near Tunitas Creek Beach, including Caltrans' work in the area and bicycle-related signage. He also discussed Cal Water's work on Alameda de las Pulgas, noting improvements to the striping layout and identifying missing bicycle infrastructure between Valparaiso Avenue and the business district. Member Langbein requested an update on the Santa Cruz/Alameda de las Pulgas project. He further raised concerns regarding the Alpine Road/Highway 280 interchange project, stating that bicyclist input was not adequately acknowledged in the report, and requested that this item be discussed at a future meeting.
- **Chair Barnes** acknowledged receipt of an email from Mike Swire regarding how the committee handles public information.
- **Member Salinger** discussed her efforts related to a protected bike facility between Sawyer Camp Extension and Cañada Road and noted ongoing challenges in securing assistance to prepare the associated grant application.

## 7. **Pescadero to Sea Trail Update** (Information)

Ms. Bryanna Whitney of the Peninsula Open Space Trust and Ms. Irma Mitton of Arriba South Coast provided a presentation on the Pescadero to Sea Trail Update and summarized the efforts completed to date.

- **Chair Barnes** asked about the involvement of the Santa Cruz Mountain Trail Stewards as it related to a segment shown during the presentation.
- **Ms. Whitney** stated that the trail segment mentioned in the presentation for work to be done by Santa Cruz Mountain Trail Stewards is intended to be a fully implemented project.
- **Member Salinger** expressed her support for the Peninsula Open Space Trust and its work.
- **Ms. Whitney** acknowledged Member Salinger's efforts related to the protected bike facility between Sawyer Camp Extension and Cañada Road and discussed challenges associated with grant administration and limited staffing resources.
- **Member Doherty** expressed interest in installing a traffic control device at the intersection of Highway 1 and Pescadero Creek Road.
- **Ms. Whitney** responded that a crossing at this location is identified as the highest-priority recommendation in the Pescadero to Sea Trail plan.

## 8. **Department of Public Works – Construction Project Updates** (Information)

Mr. Carter Choi, Principal Civil Engineer with the County of San Mateo Department of Public Works, provided a presentation on construction updates.

- **Member Langbein** asked about the segment of Alameda de las Pulgas between Avy Avenue and Valparaiso Avenue and the anticipated timing of striping in this area.

- **Mr. Choi** responded that the striping work is scheduled for late October or early November, weather permitting.

## 9. County Updates (Information)

Mr. Krzysztof Lisaj, Deputy Director of Engineering and Resource Protection with the County of San Mateo Department of Public Works, provided updates on the Alpine Road Corridor Improvement Project; speed limit changes near schools in unincorporated areas; a grant application to update the Unincorporated San Mateo County Active Transportation Plan and Local Road Safety Plan; and the recruitment process to replace the Active Transportation Group.

- **Member Langbein** expressed concerns regarding the acknowledgment of public comments related to the Alpine Road Corridor Improvement Project.
- **Mr. Lisaj** stated that he would relay the comment to the Road Operations Division within the Department of Public Works.
- **Member Salinger** asked whether the information discussed would be included in the written materials.
- **Mr. Lisaj** confirmed that the information would be included in the meeting materials and posted online.
- **Member Salinger** inquired about staffing replacements and capacity for grant writing.
- **Mr. Lisaj** confirmed that replacements are planned and that grant-writing capacity will be improved.

Sergeant Nick Boragno provided an update on his role in BPAC coordination and described the online portal used to report three-foot passing violations, including how submitted information is reviewed and processed.

- **Chair Barnes** asked whether meeting minutes were being taken and if they would be presented for review.
- **Mr. Lisaj** confirmed that meeting minutes would be provided.
