ARTS COMMISSION

Membership: 10 members; two from each supervisorial district. The requirement that two members reside in each supervisorial district may be waived by the Board of Supervisors if in the public interest. In the event that the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement, every effort shall be made to seek appointees from areas as near as practicable to the district. However, in no event shall more than three (3) members reside in the same supervisorial district. Members must be residents of the County of San Mateo, who have demonstrated an interest in and commitment to the arts. The members shall not be employees or officers of the County of San Mateo.

Duties: The Commission was formed to promote and encourage the arts in San Mateo County; to serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of Supervisors; to provide a community, needs-driven Strategic Plan for the Arts in the county; to utilize a standard of operation by adhering to an accepted Policy Statement regarding arts and culture; and, to act as a liaison with art organizations to ensure collaboration and coordination related to cultural and art activities in San Mateo County.

BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Membership: The Commission shall consist of seven (7) voting members who shall be residents of the County of San Mateo and who regularly walk and/or ride a bicycle for transportation purposes. One member shall represent the interests of the Safe Routes to School Community; one member shall represent the interests of Older Adults; one shall represent the interests of Bicycling Transportation; and the four remaining seats shall be At-Large.

Duties: To advise and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors regarding the Annual Road Resurfacing, Maintenance, and Operations Program to show how the County's annual resurfacing, maintenance and operations program can enhance bicycle and pedestrian safety, access, and infrastructure; to act as an advocate for people walking and bicycling; and to fulfill other duties and engage in other activities as directed by the Board of Supervisors.

BOARD OF BUILDING PERMIT APPEALS

Membership: 5 members who shall reside in the unincorporated area of San Mateo County; at least one member shall be a domestic resident of the "Skyline-South Coast" region of the County; at least one member shall be a domestic resident of the "Mid-Coast" region of the County; at least three members shall have technical licensed backgrounds and be actively engaged in one or more of the construction trades regulated by the codes referenced in the description of duties. The Board of Supervisors may waive any of these requirements when making appointments.

Duties: To resolve disputes between the Chief Building Official and building permit applicants or holders concerning the proper interpretation of the California Building Code; California Residential Code; California Plumbing Code; California Mechanical Code; California Electrical Code; California Historical Building Code; California Existing Building Code; California Energy Standards Code; California Green Building Standards Code; International Property Maintenance Code; and any other building code or related ordinance adopted by the San Mateo County Ordinance Code or enforced by the County of San Mateo, and authorize the Chief Building Official to record notice of violations of the foregoing codes or ordinances with the San Mateo County Recorder.

CHILD CARE PARTNERSHIP COUNCIL

Membership: 22 members; the Council is co-chaired by a member of the Board of Supervisors and the County Superintendent of Schools, both of whom are members of the Council. Of the twenty remaining members, ten are appointed by Board of Supervisors with the other ten appointed by the County Superintendent of Schools. With respect to the twenty remaining members, there are five categories of appointments with four members in each category.. Members include representatives from each region of the county: North, Central, South and Coast.

Duties: The Council provides a forum for the identification of local priorities for child care and early learning services and the development of policies and strategies to meet the priorities. It provides a community venue where the impact of state and federal child care and family policies, proposed legislation or regulation can be examined from multiple perspectives. The Council recommends decisions on the local distribution of state and federal child care funding. It conducts a mandated community-wide needs assessment, followed by a county-wide strategic plan for child care services for all children, every five years. The Council acts as the official advisory body to the San Mateo County Early Learning Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS).

Membership: 17 members; membership shall be composed of San Mateo County residents at least 60% of whom are age 60 or older. Members shall reflect the geographic, racial, ethnic, economic and social composition of the County. The total composition must include at least one member who represents interests of the disabled. A health care provider and a supportive services provider must be represented. These requirements are to be complied with as vacancies occur. Any individual elected to be a Senior Legislator for participation in the California Senior Legislature Program and who is not a member of the Commission, shall become a non-voting member of the Commission upon election as a Senior Legislator, and shall serve until the term as Senior Legislator expires.

Duties: Advises the Board of Supervisors, develops and conducts programs in conformity with specific provisions of the Older Americans Act of 1965 subject to approval of the Board of Supervisors.

related Annual Action Plans submitted to HUD; formulate recommendations projects proposed by the County's primary Notices of Funding Availability (NOFAs).

CHILD CARE PARTNERSHIP COUNCIL

Mission Statement

The San Mateo County Child Care Partnership Council takes the lead in planning and advocating for quality care and education for all children, from birth to age twelve, in San Mateo County. It is a state-mandated local planning council under joint auspices of the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors and the San Mateo County Superintendent of Schools.

Authority

In 1991 the state legislature established Local Child Care Planning Councils (LPCs) in every county in California. In San Mateo County, the LPC is known as the Child Care Partnership Council. From the beginning it was co-chaired by a member of the Board of Supervisors and County Superintendent of Schools. In 1997 with the advent of welfare reform, the role of Child Care Planning Councils was strengthened through passage of AB 1542 and the implementation of CalWORKS (Education Code, Sections 8499.3 et. seq. and 54744.) The new legislation formalized the stakeholders who must make up the Council and mandated specific duties and decisions. The Council is the official advisory body for the San Mateo County Early Learning Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS).

Membership

22 members; the Council is co-chaired by a member of the Board of Supervisors and the County Superintendent of Schools, both of whom are members of the Council. Of the twenty remaining members, ten are appointed by Board of Supervisors with the other ten appointed by the County Superintendent of Schools. With respect to the twenty remaining members, there are five categories of appointments with four members in each category: child care consumers, child care providers, public agency representatives, community representatives, and discretionary appointees. Members include representatives from each region of the county: North, Central, South and Coast.

Terms

Four-year Terms, 3 Term maximum

Duties

The Council provides a forum for the identification

of local priorities for childcare and early learning services and the development of policies and strategies to meet the priorities. It provides a community venue where the impact of state and federal child care and family policies, proposed legislation or regulation can be examined from multiple perspectives. The Council recommends decisions on the local distribution of state and federal child care funding. It conducts a mandated community-wide needs assessment, followed by a county-wide strategic plan for child care services for all children, every five years. The Council acts as the official advisory body to the San Mateo County Early Learning Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS).

No more than one-half (50%) of these Community Members may derive more than ten percent (10%) of their annual income from the health care industry. All voting members of the Co-Applicant Board shall be residents of San Mateo County. No voting member of the Co-Applicant Board shall be an employee of or an immediate family member of an employee of the San Mateo County SMC Health, with "immediate family member" referring to being a parent, spouse, domestic partner, sibling, or child (biological, adopted, step-, or half-); however, a member of the Co-Applicant Board may be an employee of the County. No members shall have a personal financial interest which would constitute a conflict of interest.
