

**Notes from Priority Setting Agenda Item at January 14, 2026 Farmworker Advisory
Commission Meeting and Process for Discussing Priorities at the March 11, 2026
Meeting**

Update on Current Priorities at January 26 Meeting:

1. Health:

Accomplishments:

- Completed a community listening session regarding the medical clinic.
- Took report to the Supervisor who presented it to the Health Department. Health Department reported on some changes in response to the comments.

Next Year: Hold another meeting with the community to ask about changes they've noticed.

2. Housing:

Accomplishments:

- Completed: workshops on housing with community partners including Puente, ALAS, Coastside Hope to hear from the community and inform them of the County's efforts on affordable housing on the coast

Needs: Housing is complicated and there is a lot of work to be done. There is a particular need for housing in the southern coastsides. Housing in Half Moon Bay is not convenient for Pescadero farmworkers. Need to identify the number of families needing housing.

Farmworkers need better housing. Most units are overcrowded. Focus on how and results.

Other Potential Priorities for Next Year from January 14 Meeting:

- Workers Rights: Continue to assure that workers know their rights. Continue workshops. Collaborate with the County office of labor standards. Some farms don't pay their workers.

Priority-Setting Discussion on March 11, 2026

- Reminder of accomplishments and needs discussed on January 14
- What other ideas are on your mind that didn't come up?
- Agree on priorities with tangible outcomes that the FAC can work on (ideally, two)
- Assign committees and lead (schedule meetings offline)
- Bring workplan to next FAC meeting.
