

Equity Questions

- Who sits at the decision making table? Are the people the program is designed to assist participating in program design?
- What does the **data** say about the need for this work? Consider race, gender, income, languages.
- Would people of color or low-income people experience higher **burdens** from this program? How would they benefit?
- How will we be **accountable** for the outcomes and communicate with the community?
- Are there equity **issues** raised by these questions? How should they be addressed?

Common Equity Review Issues

- How Will People Know About the Program?
 - Linguistically and culturally appropriate communication
 - Working with trusted local messengers to convey information
- Who Benefits?
 - Using data/mapping to identify communities most in need
 - Prioritizing assistance to those communities
- Who Has Access?
 - Online and paper applications
 - Provide navigators to assist with grant and assistance forms

What Have We Learned?

- Lots of questions about COVID-19 health and safety guidelines
- Lower income residents are most affected by the pandemic
 - Food and shelter insecurity, fear of job loss and job loss, higher COVID rates
- Lack of technology tools, digital expertise and WIFI access are increasing economic and racial disparities
- Almost all small businesses, including child care, are struggling
- Consumers and parents remain concerned about safety
- Shelter in place is challenging for young children, students, and families
- A constructive recovery depends on the entire community working together

Meeting Basic Needs (Shelter and Food)

Goals, Objectives, Recommendations

Provide basic and essential needs to the County's most vulnerable populations Provide financial and other assistance to ensure vulnerable residents remain housed

> Provide support to "mom and pop" property owners

Provide geographically targeted rental assistance to meet the needs of the most vulnerable residents

Provide funding to geographically targeted community based nonprofits to expand culturally and linguistically appropriate outreach and application assistance

Pilot the incentive program for renters and property owners to compromise on back rent to geographically targeted communities, based on best practices

Collaborate with private-sector businesses to support rental and mortgage assistance funds to keep essential workers in the area

Identify opportunities for long-term rental assistance over multiple months

Target financial support to small "mom and pop" residential property owners to geographic areas with the most vulnerable residents

Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate marketing and application support for small property owners for financial and all other assistance programs

Meeting Basic Needs (Shelter and Food)

Goals, Objectives, Recommendations

Provide basic and essential needs to the County's most vulnerable populations Ensure sufficient food and essential supplies are provided to those in need

Leverage state and federal resources and legislative opportunities Work with Second Harvest and community partners to identify any unmet food needs in geographically targeted low-income communities

Continue receiving updates from Second Harvest Food Bank on extent of need and their ability to meet that needs

Continue getting updates from Human Services on applications, approvals and backlog, if any for CalFresh

Expand capacity of Second Harvest and other local organizations to provide assistance with groceries and meals if increased need arises

Assess targeted needs for meal and essential item delivery and develop options for expanding meal delivery programs for homebound and vulnerable residents

Advocate for, monitor and analyze state and federal legislation and policy and how it may affect local property owner and renter assistance and protection

Advocate for more income-based housing vouchers

Advocate for, monitor and analyze state and federal legislation and policy and how it may affect provision of food and essential items to vulnerable residents

Provide Wi-Fi access Countywide

Technology and Connectivity for All

Increase access to equipment and Wi-Fi for students, small businesses, job seekers, and the isolated Support continued efforts of the San Mateo Internet Access Initiative partnership between ISD and County Office of Education and use the results of the pilot program to expand the most cost-effective solutions to increase access across the County

Provide targeted financial assistance to small businesses for technology equipment, internet service, and technical assistance and training

Seek partnerships with local tech firms to provide financial support for connectivity programs and internet expansion across the County

School and Out-of-School

Goals, Objectives, Recommendations

Provide safe distance learning and outof-school care

Support out-ofschool care providers Develop and disseminate public health guidance to recreation and out-of-school care providers based on school districts, the four pillars, and all guidance coming from the state

Provide a letter that a child care employee could give to a healthcare provider to obtain the now required referral for a test, particularly if the employee is asymptomatic

Consider opportunities for out-of-school care programs to utilize school sites and other space to provide distance learning support for under resourced students in need

Expand training for out-of-school providers on identification on trauma and other reportable issues

Collaborate through employee assistance programs to promote a peer-counseling support structure to provide emotional support to teachers, staff, and practitioners

Seek partnerships to provide funding sources for care providers






