- Every **registered Voter** automatically receives a ballot in the mail.
 - You can return your voted ballot by:
 - Mail through USPS
 - Dropping off at a Ballot drop box
 - Dropping off at a Vote Center
- OR-**
- Use Remote Accessible Vote by Mail
 - Vote in person



Anyone can return your ballot for you, as long as they do not get paid.
 Remember to fill out the authorization section so your ballot gets counted.

Points to remember

- You don't have to vote on every office or proposition for your ballot to be counted.
- Make sure you sign the back side of the return envelope if voting by paper (either mailed or dropped off)
- Every vote is important! Elections have been decided by a coin toss or by fewer than 10 votes.
- Local elections have a big direct impact on us.

Election Results

Final results will not be available Election night

More paper ballots (mail-in, drop off) = more time needed to accurately count votes

Paper ballot processing begins 29 days before Election, no results released until after 8pm
November 3

Vote by Mail

Every registered voter will receive a ballot in the mail in the beginning of October. You can mail your ballot back in the postage-paid envelope.



Ballot Drop Box Locations

Drop off your ballot at any of our Ballot Drop Boxes located throughout the County beginning October 5.



Vote Center Locations

Drop off your ballot or vote at any of our 45 Vote Centers located throughout the County.
