ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER, REQUEST FOR JUDICIAL NOTICE, AND SHOULD NOT BE GRANTED

The application of Plaintiff County of San Mateo (County) for a temporary restraining order and order to show cause regarding issuance of a preliminary injunction against Defendants Pacifica Beach Yoga, Thomas Antoon, and Does 1-100 (collectively, Defendants), came on for exparte hearing on January 21, 2021, at 2:00 p.m. in Department 22 of the above-entitled court via Zoom. Sarah Trela and Brian Kinney appeared on behalf of the County. Thomas Antoon appeared in pro per on behalf of Defendants.

Having considered all papers filed in support of and in opposition to the application, oral arguments of the parties, all testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, and all other pleadings and papers on file herein, the Court finds that:

- (1) There is a serious and immediate threat to public health and safety due to the SARS-CoV-2 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic:
- (2) Defendants have violated and continue to violate the State and County Public Health Orders aimed at abating the COVID-19 pandemic (Public Health Orders). Specifically, Defendants have repeatedly ignored the prohibitions and limitations imposed by those Public Health Orders on fitness facilities, gyms, and indoor gatherings; failed to ensure that those attending indoor gatherings at Defendants' place of business wear face coverings as required by those Public Health Orders; and failed to implement a social distancing protocol as required by those Public Health Orders;
  - (3) Defendants' violations of the Public Health Orders heighten the risk of transmission and

- Property without wearing face coverings in accordance with the Public Health Orders; and
- Allowing participants to attend any gathering, including classes, at the Subject
   Property without enforcing adequate social distancing in accordance with the Public Health Orders.
- 5. The County and its personnel, including employees of the COVID-19 Business Compliance
  Unit or any other Enforcement Officer recognized under County Urgency Ordinance No. 20585, including officers of the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office or the Pacifica Police
  Department, are authorized to enter onto the Subject Property to post notice of this Order in
  visible locations on the Subject Property, to distribute this Order to Defendants and/or any
  other persons present on or near the Subject Property, and to monitor and ensure compliance
  with this Order any time, including at any time that classes or other group fitness activities
  may be lawfully held on the Subject Property, while this Order is in effect.
- 6. The County and its personnel, including employees of the COVID-19 Business Compliance Unit and any other Enforcement Officer recognized under County Urgency Ordinance No. 20-585, including officers of the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office or the Pacifica Police Department, are authorized to take reasonable measures to prevent members of the public from attending indoor gathering, including group classes, at the Subject Property, including locking or otherwise securing public entrances.

## ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

- 7. Defendants are ORDERED to appear on **February 4, 2021**, at **11:00 a.m.**, in Department 22 of the above-entitled court to show cause why a preliminary injunction should not issue, prohibiting, restraining, and enjoining Defendants, and each of them, and their agents, employees, representatives, members, and volunteers, and all persons acting under, in concert with, or for them, from:
  - a. Hosting any class or gathering at the Subject Property that does not fully comply with all Public Health Orders, including holding indoor classes or, when allowed in the future, indoor classes above the capacity allowed by the Public Health Orders:

- Allowing participants to attend any gathering, including classes, at the Subject
   Property without wearing face coverings in accordance with the Public Health
   Orders; and
- c. Allowing participants to attend any indoor gatherings, including classes, at the Subject Property without enforcing adequate social distancing in accordance with the Public Health Orders.
- 8. The hearing on the Order to Show Cause shall be conducted through Zoom video or audio conference unless otherwise ordered by the Court. The Zoom log-in credentials can be found at: http://www.sanmateocourt.org/court\_divisions/civil/dept22.php.
- 9. If a party wishes to appear in person, that party must notify the Court at least 48 hours before the hearing date by email at dept22@sanmateocourt.org or by telephone at 650-261-5122. The Court strongly prefers to receive communications by email. If a party chooses to appear in person, the party MUST comply with this Court's COVID Order #11 which is available at: http://www.sanmateocourt.org/documents/court\_news\_and\_notices/080520a.pdf.
- 10. Any recording of the hearing or any other court proceeding held by video or audio conference, including "screen-shots" or other visual or audio copying of a hearing or conference IS PROHIBITED unless otherwise permitted by the Court. Violation of these prohibitions may result in sanctions, including restricted entry to future hearings and conferences, denial of entry to future hearings and conferences, removal of Court-issued media credentials, or any other sanctions deemed appropriate by the Court.
- 11. This Order Granting Temporary Restraining Order and Order to Show Cause re Issuance of Preliminary Injunction shall be served on Defendants no later than **January 25, 2021**, by personal service, overnight courier, facsimile, or electronic mail. Proof of service shall be filed no later than **January 27, 2021**.
- 12. Any opposition papers to the Order to Show Cause shall be filed and served on Plaintiffs by personal service, overnight courier, facsimile, or electronic mail no later than **January 29**, **2021** at **5:00** p.m.
- 13. Any reply papers shall be filed and served on Defendants by personal service, overnight
