Update on County Response to COVID-19

Redwood City – The County of San Mateo continues to work to protect public health and safety in response to the novel coronavirus known as COVID-19.

The County of San Mateo's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) remains open to coordinate countywide response and communications in response to the situation. The EOC's Joint Information Center will provide daily status reports Monday through Friday until further notice. Today's report:

Project Baseline, the state's free testing provider in San Mateo County, now uses a self-administered swab process that is quick and simple to complete. - Wednesday, June 10 and Thursday, June 11 at Cunha Intermediate School, 600 Church Street, Half Moon Bay
- Friday, June 12 and Saturday, June 13 at Sports House Parking Lot, 3151 Edison Way, Redwood City
- Monday, June 15 at the San Mateo County Event Center, 1346 Saratoga Drive, San Mateo
