For what purpose/reasons would a minor would be placed in secured detention?: A minor could be placed in secure detention for one of three reasons: 1. The crime being investigated is of a serious nature, generally a felony, 2. the youth is considered a flight risk, or 3. there is no space available in the non secure area for the investigation. In the 2017 case, 3 minors and 1 adult were arrested for armed robbery. The one youth placed in secure custody had been armed and on probation for gang activity.
How often is secured detention reviewed and by whom? <u>Secure detention reports are reviewed monthly by Ken Cochran.</u>

What is the proximity of the secured detention area to adult inmates? There is no access.
Describe the procedure for intoxicated or substance abusing minors: If there is a safety concern, paramedics are called from the field and the youth is taken to a medical facility. If they are functioning and can care for themselves, youth are monitored by the officer. Youth are taken to the hospital before going to YSC.

Facility is orderly and clean. It is not normal practice to place youth in secure detention. This occurs only when appropriate based on the crime being investigated and /or when space is not available in non secure areas. Boxes are checked off in the log books indicating that youth were advised of the purpose of detention, expected duration and the limit of 6 hours. However, there are no standard operating procedures for informing the youth of what to expect when they are brought into the police station. Because the length of an investigation can vary significantly, youth are not told the length of time they should expect

to be detained. We recommend, to the degree possible, a standard orientation be given to all youth brought into custody, informing them of the investigation process, an estimate of how long they will be
