#### **IV.** New Business

#### **CCP Plan Overview**

John T. Keene, Chief Probation Officer

- Chief Keene reported on the AB109 population.
- Chief Keene mentioned that new legislation has brought about additional CCP requirements at the state level.
- Our CCP plan had to be updated as part of these new requirements in order to secure funding.
- An evaluation was done, and our agency partners collaborated to provide suggestions for a revamp. However, the state's December deadline would not provide enough time for a thorough review of our new plan.
- Chief Keene suggested that the CCP reconvene early next year to review the plan and make any improvements.
- Updates to AB109: Many releases are the result of a decision by the courts to reduce the population in San Quentin by 50%; this will impact San Mateo County.
- The CDCR will provide Probation with a list of those who are eligible for release.
- Mr. Wagstaffe commented that the DA's Office receives this list as well and uses it to contact crime victims to notify them of early releases.
- Parole functions for the region will now be handled out of San Jose.
- Out-of-county PRCS numbers remain high; 17 of 45 defendants were out-of-county.
- Violations: 91% were technical violations.

#### **Sheriff's Office**

Carlos Bolanos, Sheriff

- Sheriff Carlos Bolanos reported in-custody and NCRIC AB109 data for the third quarter.
- In custody population decreased from 969 to 709; 115 inmates are waiting to go to CDCR.
- Realignment: Top crimes include drugs/alcohol and ID theft; there has been an uptick in vehicle crimes but there was no significant involvement in violent crimes among this population.
- There were 27 1170H cases; 6 were split-sentences, 21 were straight sentences.
- Split sentences have dropped by approx. 69% over the past 4 years; average length of stay was about 161 days.
- Thirty percent were residents of San Mateo County, 33% were out-of-county, and 37% were homeless or transient.

### *Are the homeless numbers consistent or is this changing? A:Sheriff Bolanos stated that he will get the data on this and report back.*

#### Human Services Agency

Jennifer Valencia, Director of Employment Services

- Jennifer Valencia reported that Service Connect referrals are down due to Covid-19. Benefits have also decreased.
- Employment Services has been placing people in essential-work positions in the service industry.
- Service Connect is now conducting virtual workshops; 63 workshops were conducted; 28 participants received a certificate of completion.
- Out-of-custody health services have also been added.

#### **Health System**

Louise Rogers, Chief of Health System and Scott Gruendl, Director of BHRS

- Louise Rogers and Scott Gruendl reported for the Health System and BHRS.
- The partnership between Health and the Sheriff's Office has been going well; a new electronic health record process has also been implemented to track patients' health.
- Scott Gruendl reported that 43 cases were added, and participation increased in across all programs.
- Top five services include: Alcohol/other drug residential treatment services; alcohol/other drug intensive out-patient, sober living, mental health services and mental health residential services. There were increases to medication treatment services as well.
- There has been a reduction to in-patent admissions since adding the acute unit in the Maguire Facility.

#### **Questions**

Is methamphetamine still the top drug of use? A:Yes, this has been consistent.

#### What's driving the increase of Vivitrol injections?

A: Correctional Health has been successful in moving this treatment forward because they have trained providers who can administer injections.
