ARTS RWC was instrumental in many milestones

- 2012 Redwood City Parks and Arts Foundation founded
- 2014 and on Numerous public art projects starting with the Utility Box Mural program, followed by murals, sculptures, shadow art & more
- 2016 Percent for Art Ordinance passed by City Council
- 2018 Public Arts Master Vision adopted; Civic Cultural Commission changed to Arts Commission
- 2020-21 Center for Creativity vision pursued








Redwood City Center for Creativity

VISION:

- A permanent facility dedicated to house and program a broad range of the arts
- Classroom, studio, exhibition, theater, and retail space
- Space to be reconfigurable, flexible, and multi-use to maximize the usability and impact
- Serving all ages and abilities in the city, county and beyond

MISSION:

• Catalyze creative exploration and community engagement. Be a place for all to create and experience art in many forms and access arts education and enrichment.

FACETS:

- Arts instruction and mentoring
- Participatory creative experiences for all ages
- Art exhibitions, cultural performances, lectures and workshops featuring local and international artists
- Studio/performance spaces with shared resources for working artists and non-profits
- Cafe, arts-oriented retail and outdoor spaces

2021 Survey shows strong community support

Public survey completed Nov. 13, 2021

PURPOSE: Gauge the community interest in this vision for a Center for Creativity in Redwood City, leading to a feasibility study

Versions for adults and kids, in English, Spanish, Mandarin

PRELIMINARY FINDINGS:

- >1900 respondents (66% Redwood City; 88% San Mateo County)
- >80% believe there's a NEED for an arts center in Redwood City
- >80% believe an arts center would enhance life for city residents





Why an Arts Center?

In addition to the fulfilment and enjoyment of individuals who make and partake of the arts, access to the arts significantly improves broad aspects of civic life economics, health, education, community cohesion

ARTS + ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Arts generate 4.2% of U.S. GDP
- Arts support 4.92 million jobs in the U.S.
- 53% of businesses value arts partnerships

ARTS+TOURISM

- 68% of tourism in U.S. is driven by art
- Cultural tourists spend 2X more
- 68% increase in empathy for other cultures
- 80% of people explore new places for the arts

ARTS+HOUSING

- 20% rise in property values
- Arts raise awareness
- More art = more value

Art Improves Civic Life - cont.

ARTS + LIFELONG LEARNING & YOUTH EDUCATION

- \$1 for after school art programs save \$9 on other costs
- 2X as likely to graduate college
- 100 points higher on their SAT
- 4 out of 5 more likely to vote
- 9 out of 10 say arts increase connection to community
- 40% more likely to have friends from different racial groups
- IQ increased by music training in 3-5 year olds
- 63% reduction in risk of dementia

ARTS + COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & COHESION

- 86% of arts participants more involved in civic issues
- 40% feel more positive about their community after taking part in the arts
- Arts-rich neighborhoods 1.6X more connected
- Arts participation unites generations, reduces fear, and empowers citizens

ARTS+IMMIGRATION

- 85% strengthen community ties
- 57% believe American culture improved by immigrant cultures
- Culture improves immigrants' well-being



Yet today, the arts are in decline

- Arts education in public schools has been severely cut since Proposition 13 in 1978
- Arts of all kinds visual, music, performance, and more - are disappearing from the Bay Area because the costs of living and running arts businesses are unsustainable
- Galleries, artist studios, and community theater groups have been forced to reduce programs, close doors, or move to more affordable areas

These ongoing losses are reducing cultural richness and economic value in Redwood City and the region.

- Supplement arts education and provide creative experiences for children and youth
- Enrich families and community members through ready access to learn, create and experience art
- Support working artists through
 - access to affordable studio, exhibition, practice and performance spaces
 - o professional development programs
- Be *THE*resource center for all arts and cultural activities, events, performances and opportunities in Redwood City and the peninsula
