3. Report Out

Supervisor's Report, presented by Maggie Cornejo, Legislative Aid:

• Measure K investments: Board of Supervisors approved funding for non-profit organizations in the area. Casa Circulo, Generations United, Hispanic Foundation of Silicon Valley received grants to continue their work.

County Manager's Report, presented by Justin Mates, Deputy County Manager:

- The Board of Supervisors approved two new programs under the San Mateo County Strong initiative: \$2 million dollars for small business assistance program and \$500,000 in grants for a micro-food business grant program.
- The Board of Supervisors initiated an approval of a new order as the first reading of a new ordinance to opt into the State's Micro-Enterprise Home Kitchen Operations Law
 - Home kitchens can operate commercially without having to satisfy all the requirements.

Council Member's Report, presented by Brooks Esser, Chair Member; Juan Carlos Prado, Vice Chair; Ever Rodriguez, Council Member; Blair Whitney, Council Member.

- Esser: Attended the Middlefield Road Improvement Project meeting for business owners. Meeting explained the impact to the businesses and work around solutions.
- Esser: Met with Ron Gonzalez, President of the Hispanic Foundation of Silicon Valley, to go over programs that the foundation is running and can benefit North Fair Oaks.
 - o Was invited to present to NFOCC in the beginning of 2022.
- Esser: The North Fair Oaks Community Festival is being organized for Summer 2022. Esser will be representing the Council on the organizing committee.
 - o The focus on this community festival are local businesses and community groups.
- Prado: Noticed that there has been more communication between the County and small businesses regarding the Middlefield Road Improvement Project- especially among Spanish-speakers. Would like to congratulate the County on these efforts.
- Rodriguez: Attended the Equity Forum led by Shireen Malekafzali which went over on how to gather suggestions to advance equity throughout the County.
 - Also spoke to Hugo Torres, Program Director for the Siena Youth Center, on developing a curriculum around the environment and climate change geared towards the children.
 - Siena Youth Center will be hosting a carnival on Thursday, July 29 which will provide food, games, raffles, and COVID-19 vaccines.
 This effort is to fundraise for the eighth-grade trip to Europe.

• Whitney: Turned in some fireworks a friend gifted them to the Menlo Park Firefighter Department- turned out to be a process due to the nature of the fireworks. Didn't see a difference in this year's Fourth of July fireworks.
