Utility Undergrounding:

 MacArthur Avenue to and Fifth Avenue

Sanitary Sewer Replacement:

 Douglas Avenue to Sixth Avenue

- New lane configuration: 1 lane in each direction
- Widened Sidewalks
- Street Lights
- Buffered Bike Lanes
- High Visibility Crosswalks
- Rectangular Rapid Flash Beacon (RRFB)

- Traffic Signals

- Green Infrastructure/stormwater treatment features







Traffic Signals and Clinic/Redwood Junction Driveway




• Three (3) new traffic signals - Hurlingame, Clinic/Redwood Junction driveway, and Pacific Ave.

- Signals will be interconnected to the railroad crossing equipment.
- New railroad crossing equipment at Clinic/Redwood Junction driveway.



Modifications near Railroad Crossing



- Northside Avenue one way from Stanford Avenue to Middlefield Road and right turn exit only
- Median on Middlefield Road to prevent left turns from Northside Avenue to Middlefield Road

- Anticipated Bid Opening: December 15, 2020
- Anticipated Award Contract: January, 2021
