

#### CRIMES INVOLVING JUVENILES NORTH FAIR OAKS 2016-2020



This report shows the juvenile crime trends in the North Fair Oaks area from January 1, 2016 to October 31, 2020.

The Sheriff's Office is committed to addressing juvenile crimes as proactively and effectively as possible.

The chart shows the past five years of juvenile crimes in North Fair Oaks area. Although the juvenile crime rate doubled between 2016 and 2017, and increased an additional 62% between 2017 and 2018. In 2019, there was a reduction in juvenile criminal cases by 19% from 2018, and 2020 saw an additional 51% drop compared to 2019.

#### **ASSAULT AND BATTERY**

Assault and battery related crimes remained relatively the same from 2016 to 2020 with only a slight decrease in 2019.

Truancy and probation statistics have also shown a relatively low number of cases.


#### DIVERSION

The Sheriff's Office is committed to providing programs focusing on steering juveniles away from criminal behavior.

These diversion efforts are the main reason for the relatively low juvenile crime rates in the area. In 2020, these efforts include 52 diversion cases, 58 tattoo removals and 23 crisis intervention cases.



#### **OTHER** JUVENILE INVOLVED CRIMES



This chart shows crimes that juveniles have been exposed to or that have potential influence on their well-being or mental health.

The Community Alliance to Revitalized Our Neighborhood program (CARON) is working with the community and community organizations to continue to offer programs that address this issues.
