Public Comment	 Delmy Cazzalli (NFO Resident): Has concerns with illegal activities in NFO. Says that kids from Sequoia High School doing illegal things. Has contacted the Sheriff's Office but the kids always hide when they drive by. Jennifer Wone (Palo Alto Housin): Palo Alto Housing will be proposing a 67 unit affordable housing project in North Fair Oaks. There will be an information session on Thursday, October 5 from 6:30pm-8:30pm at the Siena Youth Center.
Sheriff's Report	 Presentation by Lieutenant Christina Corpus Review of crimes activities between the 1st Quarter and the 2nd Quarted of 2017. There were 3,282 calls in Q1 and 3,501 calls in Q2 Deputy foot patrol has increased There is a minimum of 1 Spanish speaking deputy per patrol team The Sheriff's Office created a calendar in English and Spanish to remind the community of the street sweeping days Violent crimes are down 17% from 2016 and property crimes are down 16% from last year. Juvenile crime statistics for 2017 YTD were also presented

- Lt. Corpus referenced two cases in which firearms were recovered and in which burglars were caught
- The CARON program is hosting the North Fair Oaks Community Academy which started on September 25 located at VERBO Family church
- On October 22 the Sheriff's Office will host coffee and donust at St. Anthony's Church from 9:00am-12:30pm
- Sheriff's Deputies read to the children at Fair Oaks Library every Tuesday
- The Sheriff's Office is co-hosting a childrens haloween party with the library on Wednesday, October 25 between 4:00pm and 6:00pm. There will be a costume contest, prizes, scary stories and treats
- On November 15, they Sheriff's Office will host an immigration forum at the Siena Youth Center from 6:30pm-8:00pm
- On December 2 between 10:00am and 1:00pm, the Sheriff's Office and the Siena Youth Center will host a community basketball game
- Patrol Deputies assist with feeding the community at St. Anthony's dining hall every Friday
- Deputies stop by Fair Oaks Community School and Garfield Community School at lunch time to have lunch with the kids
- Non Spanish-speaking deputies are handing out cards to Spanish-spearking individuals that they stop to let them know that the Sheriff's Office does not cooperate with Federal Immigration Officials
- Lt. Corpus showed the video that the Sheriff's Office made showing the community work and relationship building that has happened in North Fair Oaks

Parking Restrictions at the Parking Lot located at 3060- 3080 Middlefield Road	 Presentation by Joe Lo Coco New parking lot at Middlefield Road and Second Avenue All existing diagonal parking spaces on Middlefield Road will be replaced with parallen parking spaces This will reduce available parking from 125 spaces to 70 spaces New County operated lots will offset this loss of on-streetparking by adding 59 spaces, a net gain of 4 parking spaces No overnight parking will be allowed. Parking will only be allowed from 7am-10pm Parking will be limited to 2 hours and will be enforced on weekdays and weekends The purpose of the parking restrictions is to make parking available for business patrons The lots are not intended to be used for resident overflow parking The restrictions are also in place to manage factors such as overnight parking that commonly result in increased trash The lot at Middlefield and Second is expected to be completedin November 2017 and construction on the lot at Berkshire and Huntington Ave will begin in early 2018
Questions from Council Members Public Comment	 Melinda Dubroff: Will there be a garbage can at the lot at Middlefield and Second Ave. Joe Lo Coco: It's not planned at the moment, although trash cans might be placed at places along the sidewalk when the redesign happens Linda Lopez: Are there going to be any trees? Joe Lo Coco: Yes, there will be some landscaping, a couple trees and bushes Rosaura Lopez: Have you thought about having overnight parking for businesses? Joe Lo Coco: No because we don't want people parking there overnight to limit trash at the lot No public comment
Use permit to allow an accessory building to be located within	 Presentation by Carmelisa J Morales Project proposal is to build a 464 sq.ft detached one car garage with an attached one-car carport Location it 12.5 ft form the rear property line and witing the rear quarter of the parcel

the rear quarter of the parcel where, in the case of a parcel abutting upon two or more streets, accessory buildings may not encroach upon the outer quarter of the parcel nearest either street. The project is located at 3520 Bay Road in the unincorporated North Fair Oaks area of San Mateo County.	 Proposal also includes legalization of the unpermitted conversion of the 522 sq.ft attached two-car garage into a conditioned space Project complies with the North Fair Oaks Community Plan and is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) One neighbor provided comments that they would like the proposed structure set back at least 15 ft. form the side walk and be subject to the daylight plane requirement, that no trees be removed and that unmaintained fences be maintained
Questions from Council Members	 Melinda Dubroff: Does the use permit include the removal of the fence? Carmelisa Morales: It does not Melinda Dubroff: is it common for the county to approve fences that extend beyond the property line Carmelisa Morales: Approvals vary on a case-by-case basis
Public Comment	 Property Owner: We recognize that the fence is ugly and we plan to do something about it, we're just not sure what yet Jeff Mitchel, Neighbor: Is there going to be a driveway entrance from spring street into the garage? James Coulter, Neighbor: In favor of the project, scope is small. Notes that project should improve aesthetics of the area
