January - March

- Election of an Interim Co-chair: Rebecca Carabez
- Creation of the Pride Visibility Project: Giuliana Garcia, Lelan Anders, Krystle Cansino, Carmen O'Shea
- In February, Frankie Sapp started as the Director of the Pride Center

April - June

- Launch of the Pride Visibility Project, adjusted to virtual and unknown SIP status
 - Commission launched communications in April, May
 - Commission attended City Council meetings in May, June
 - Commission attended Pride Flag raisings in June
 - all 20 cities in San Mateo County issued a Pride Proclamation; municipalities also recognized Pride
 - 14 cities raised Pride Flags
 - Collaborators included Linda Wolin, Pride Center, CoastPride and community members in Foster City, Millbrae, and San Bruno
- June Pride Planning
 - Adjusted to Virtual Event & Expanded Programming to full Week
 - Dana Johnson led Pride Planning
 - LGBTQ Book Author Series featuring Steve Disselhorst

July - December
