1. Call to Order

Meeting was called to order at 3:18 p.m.

2. Public Comment

3. Old Business

M: Manheimer/S: Francone. The minutes of October 16, 2014, were approved as submitted.

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4. New Business

Update on AB109 Offender Populations:

- John Keene, Chief Probation Officer, opened the meeting by welcoming members and guests including local officials and community members to the official opening of the David E. Lewis Community Reentry Center.
- Chief Keene reported on Q1 for the Post-Release Community and Mandatory Supervision Update—he stated that there were 72 new supervisees.
- Chief Keene commented on the large number of supervisees in the 26-35 age groups—he sees it as an opportunity to focus on building their skills that will serve them into the future.
- Mark Robbins, Sheriff's Captain, talked about Q1 and Q2 (7/1-12/31/2014) AB109 In-Custody Monthly reports. He reported that 137 inmates were sentenced under 1170(h) of which 64% were straight sentences—36% were split.
- Captain Robbins stated that with the passage of Proposition 47 (Prop 47), there were 14 individuals originally sentenced under 1170(h) that were resentenced under Prop 47—13 were actually serving custody time and 1 was on mandatory supervision.
- Captain Robbins stated that a little over 18% of the jail population was realigned inmates (AB109) at the end of December.
- John Joy, Human Services Agency (HSA) Director, reported on Q1 and Q2 (7/1-12/31/2014) Service Connect Dashboard. He commented that the lower enrollment numbers for General Assistance was impacted by the success of the San Mateo County rapid employment program.
- John Joy briefly talked about other services they provide to their client such as motel vouchers, shelter beds, food gift cards, monthly bus passes, and clothing vouchers.
- Louise Rogers, Deputy Chief of Health System, reported that Health System has seen 104 additional clients YTD through Service Connect. She stated that alcohol and drug treatment have been the primary services her agency has provided for Service Connect.
- The Service Connect team has added a Nurse Practioner—the Nurse Practioner will proactively link clients with the health care services that they need.
