





EACH DISTRICT IS AN INDEPENDENT ENTITY WITH ITS OWN SEPARATE BUDGET


- Each District's Governing Board is the Board of Supervisors
- ➤ The District receives Sewer Service Charges and limited property taxes within the District boundaries to fund sewer service
- ➤ The Sewer Service Charges are a Fee For Service, Not a Tax
- ➤ The District collects Sewer Service Charges on the Tax Bill because it is least costly way to collect the fee

DCSD Sample Property Tax Allocation (TRA 076-005)



HISMD Sample Property Tax Allocation (TRA 053-017)





- Purchased shared maintenance equipment (CCTV camera, flushing/vacuum trucks, and Vac-Con flusher-vacuum truck)
- Sanitary Sewer Overflow (SSO) Response, Reporting, Water Quality Monitoring, and Public Awareness Program
- Development and continuous updating of Sewer System Management Plan (SSMP)
- Continue to provide 24/7 emergency response to clear blockages in private laterals and services during COVID-19 pandemic






- > Improvements are recommended based on the following:

- Portions of your Sewer Service Charges collected are used to pay for improvements.





FUTURE PROJECTS AND ESTIMATED COSTS

Devonshire CSD:

Phase 2 - Winding Wy. and Windsor Dr. \$329,000 (1,060 ft)

Harbor Industrial SMD:

Phase 2 - Old County Rd., Harbor Blvd. \$496,000 and O'Neil Ave. (1,600 ft)

Scenic Heights CSD:

Phase 2 – Cordilleras Rd. from Lakeview \$1,488,000 Way to Canyon Rd. (4,020 ft)


PAYING FOR SEWAGE TRANSPORT, TREATMENT, AND DISPOSAL

- > SVCW charges member agencies (Redwood City, San Carlos, Belmont, and West Bay Sanitary District) for sewage treatment
- Agreement with the City of San Carlos for sewage transport through City pipes with treatment and disposal at the SVCW
- Harbor Industrial SMD pays a portion of the City's allocable share of SVCW expenditures for treatment and transport
 - The City's costs are estimated to increase by 4.5% for FYs 2019-22
 - Based on number of ERUs for Devonshire CSD and Scenic Heights CSD
 - Based on quantity and quality of flow for Harbor Industrial SMD


Devonshire CSD Expenditure & Revenue Comparison


Harbor Industrial SMD Expenditure & Revenue Comparison

RATE SETTING TIMELINE

Key Dates	Actions
June 2, 2020	Introduce Ordinance with proposed sewer service rate and set Public Hearing for July 21, 2020.
June 5, 2020	Send Proposition 218 notice (45 days prior to public hearing) to property owners with proposed rate.
July 21, 2020	Hold public hearing, adopt Ordinance setting rate, and adopt FY 2020-21 Sewer Service Charges Report based on the adopted rate.
