This year, artwork from over 70 local artists will be on view in The Caldwell & Community Galleries. The exhibition features a diverse range of medium: painting, photography, charcoal drawing, mixed media, digital painting, and yarn work.

The artists featured in *Women's View 2022* likewise represent a great diversity reflective of the larger San Mateo County community. In their artistic practices, these artists draw on a vast array of heritages, lived experiences, and finely tuned imaginations.
