



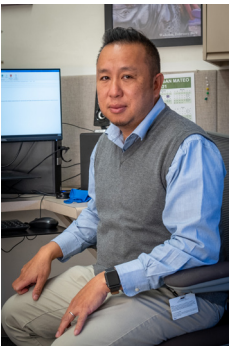
COVID-19 Status Update
