### BACKGROUND:

This report covers research and activities since I began as the Natural Resource Manager on February 18, 2014 and the Commission's February 6, 2014 meeting.

#### DISCUSSION:

Highlight of Activities and Research Topics:

- 1. Scientific Permit Process: See separate report, Action Item, 8.C.
- 2. Fitzgerald Marine Reserve Management Plans: Provided research and expert opinions concerning appropriate restoration activities, phasing, and considerations concerning the San Vincente Creek Restoration Management Plan and the Cypress Grove Management Plan.
- 3. Met and discussed roles of key office staff and some field staff with relevant site visits for current projects (Fitzgerald Marine Reserve, San Bruno Mountain, Edgewood).
- 4. Friends Groups Outreach: To date I have met with Friends of Huddart and Wunderlich Parks, Friends of Fitzgerald Marine Reserve, Friends of San Pedro Valley Park, San Bruno Mountain Watch, and Friends of Edgewood.
- 5. San Bruno Mountain Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) research and participation in the Technical Advisory Committee to discuss and evaluate a contractor for a new monitoring and management contract.
- 6. Plan, design, and implement fern planting along Coastal Trail at Fitzgerald Marine Reserve scheduled for April 5, 2014 with community volunteers.

- 7. Overseeing the implementation of a monitoring and BMP action plan to reduce the Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) for bacteria in San Pedro Creek and at Pacific State Beach.
- 8. Attended the Weed Management Areas bimonthly meeting and will lead the next meeting on a field trip to Devil's Slide in May and discuss our strategy for invasive plant management.
- 9. Attended the Technical Advisory Committee meeting for the Fitzgerald Area of Special Biological Significance.
- 10. Dog Policy: Specifically reviewing other agencies, counties, and cities with dynamic dog policies. As an example Portland Parks and Recreation, City of Boulder, City of Minneapolis, and Sydney Australia. In progress.
- 11. MOU research and suggestions. In progress.
- 12. SWOT Analysis: Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities, and Threats analysis. In progress.
- 13. Set-up meetings with East Bay Regional Parks and other regional open space agencies to evaluate their natural resources departments and gather information about developing our program.
- 14. GIS research and opportunities for collaboration and integration with other open space land management agencies.
- 15. Continued reading of all relevant planning documents concerning all Parks and relevant biological resources.
- 16. Identifying important training and collaboration opportunities including CEQA courses and the Bay Area Open Space Council's upcoming annual meeting.
