DISCUSSION:

Volunteer Activities

Spring and Early Summer Volunteer Activity: A variety of special volunteer service activities took place in San Mateo County Parks in addition to the service provided by Friends and other partners. Students from Sequoia High School, Sacred Heart High School, San Mateo Kiwanis and Key Club members, and North Shoreview School with a total of 350 students contributed 1,300 hours of service. In addition, adult volunteers from Thermo Fisher Electronics, and the Student Conservation Association in partnership with Genentech volunteered at Edgewood Park and San Bruno Mountain Park, respectively. Approximately 50 volunteers, including crew leaders from the Trail Center, partnered with Park staff to celebrate National Trail Day and clear and widen the Skyline Trail segment of the Ridge Trail in early June.

<u>Scout Projects</u>: The Department has strong relationship with scout troops throughout the County. This spring and summer, scouts are working with staff to achieve the highest awards in their programs. Below are some projects that are in progress or have been completed:

- Split rail fence installation, Merchant Marine Overlook, Coyote Point Recreation Area
- Beach group landscape improvements, Coyote Point Recreation Area
- Beach area cleanup and rock removal project, Coyote Point Recreation Area

- Develop two accessible paths: From the old Beach lot to the duck pond area and another between the lawn and the Beach group picnic area.
- Edgewood Trailhead at Edgewood Road: replace aged metal culvert with plastic culvert and build retaining wall on both ends.
- Install new post and add sand to the volleyball court at Werder Shelter at Huddart Park to make it a regulation size court.
- Flood Park: install the brick planter boxes at Flood Park in front of the old office.

Community Engagement

<u>Update: Reimagine Flood Park</u>: Close to 80 people attended the second community meeting on June 23 held at the Fair Oaks Community Center to learn what park users would like to see in a redesigned Flood Park. The same format as was presented in the first meeting in May was followed and garnered a lot of enthusiasm and ideas. In order to capture the needs and interests of those who were not able to attend the meetings, an on-line survey in English and Spanish was made available and remained open for 30 days. At the end of the survey period, 209 people had shared their ideas in this way.

Gates + Associates, Flood Park project consultants, will analyze the data collected from meetings and surveys to develop three conceptual designs which will be presented at the September 1 community meeting. At this meeting participants will be asked to voice their preferences of the models and elements.

<u>July 11 Take A Hike</u>: Park staff partnered with volunteers with San Bruno Mountain Watch to lead this month's hike on the Summit Loop and Saddle Loop trails. Sixty hikers joined us for a beautiful morning that allowed hikers to take in spectacular views from either trail.
