According to the staff, the County storm water staff told them it was okay if they don't use soap. It is not. That is still a violation of the county NPDES MS4 permit.

If this permit is granted ensure that vehicle and equipment wash down drains to a pretreatment device and the sewer, not the beach. And check in with storm water staff to see if they are up to date.

Hi Brenda,

Thanks for our letter. The County's concerns regarding washwater are in relation to the trash storage area. To my knowledge, there hasn't been any complaints regarding vehicle and equipment wash down. Please let me know if you see these activities. Here are the pertinent requirements for washwater communicated to the owner:

As stated in the County's letter (Attachment E of the staff report), the County has informed the applicant and owner that:

All stormwater discharges to on and off-site areas which do not drain to a sanitary sewer and/or areas which drain to the beach shall cease immediately. Within 14 days of the date of this letter, the property owner shall submit a drainage plan for washdown and trash enclosure areas. The drainage plan shall demonstrate that all washdown water will be directed to the sanitary sewer system.

Also, Condition 10 of the Staff Report requires modification to the drainage system of the trash storage area. See sentences underlined below.

10. Trash storage areas (including recycling or food compactor areas or similar areas) shall be covered (a built-in cover for each dumper is acceptable) and the grade modified so that spills, any stormwater and wash water flow to drains connected to the sanitary sewer system, subject to the local sanitary sewer agency's authority and standards and review and approval of the Department of Public Works. The owner shall obtain a building permit for drainage improvements and complete the work in compliance with Condition No. 3. <u>All outdoor washing activities are prohibited, except in areas which drain directly to the sanitary sewer. Wash water is prohibited from entering parking or vegetation/landscaping areas.</u>

Thank you for addressing the concerns of the Midcoast Community Council in the Conditions of Approval for PLN2015-00297, La Costanera patios.

Contrary to assurances in the applicant's October 14 letter, the high contrast white paint on roof utility fixtures (vent pipes, gutters, downspouts, and rooftop enclosure) has not been restored to earth-toned color that blends with the brown building, per condition of PLN2015-00179. Please include this requirement in Condition 3.

The intent of the original design and permit for this restaurant to minimize visual impacts should be maintained. The Scenic Corridor's coastal viewshed, from mountain ridge to ocean, from Devil's Slide to Montara Gateway, as been preserved as natural open-space public land. The restaurant site is highly visible from highway and beach and is the only commercial use in the entire viewshed.
