Hi Steven,

I have had a second home in Pescadero for over 19 years. Safety is the biggest reason to add additional cell nodes. A few years ago when I arrived at my house, there was an unknown car parked in my driveway behind a gate that had been closed. Since my cell phone didn't work I had no way to immediately call 911.

Accidents on Cabrillo Highway are common. Bicyclists are frequent visitors. School buses frequent this road, too. Sixteen years ago, I founded and still run a non-profit that takes students from underserved schools to Ano Nuevo each Jan and Feb. The majority of the 1200 students I send to Ano Nuevo drive south from Highway 92 to Ano Nuevo via school bus. There is good cell phone coverage much of the way....except in the Pescadero area. Many students visit the area for Outdoor Ed. Safety is a concern as many school buses use that section of road to access the tide pools at Bean Hollow and Pigeon Point and to visit the many other natural wonders of the coast.

I fully support this project with the hope that it gives this area broader cell phone coverage to ensure the safety of all.
