I am writing with concern about the proposed construction at 1900 East Ave., Montara, CA.

I live adjacent to the proposed development location and walk along the proposed driveway and that property regularly with my children. I have personally seen California Red Legged Frogs (CRLF) on that property dozens of times over the past 10 years. For some reason the biological report for the proposed construction seems to omit that these frogs exist on that property.

I was under the impression that these frogs are protected and threatened. If so, I urge the planning department to reconsider approval of this project based on an incomplete or misleading biological report. Another more thorough report should be commissioned to reveal the true biological diversity of that land, including the existence of the CRLF.
