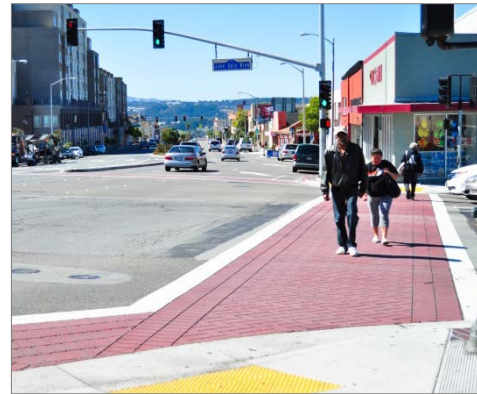

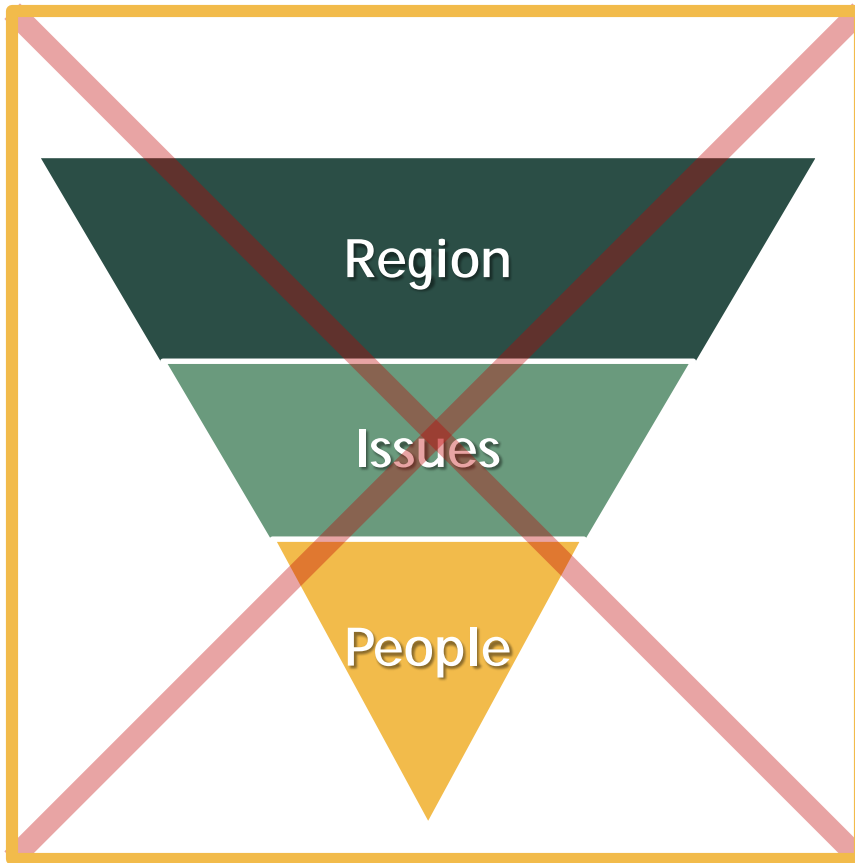
MESSAGING BEST PRACTICES

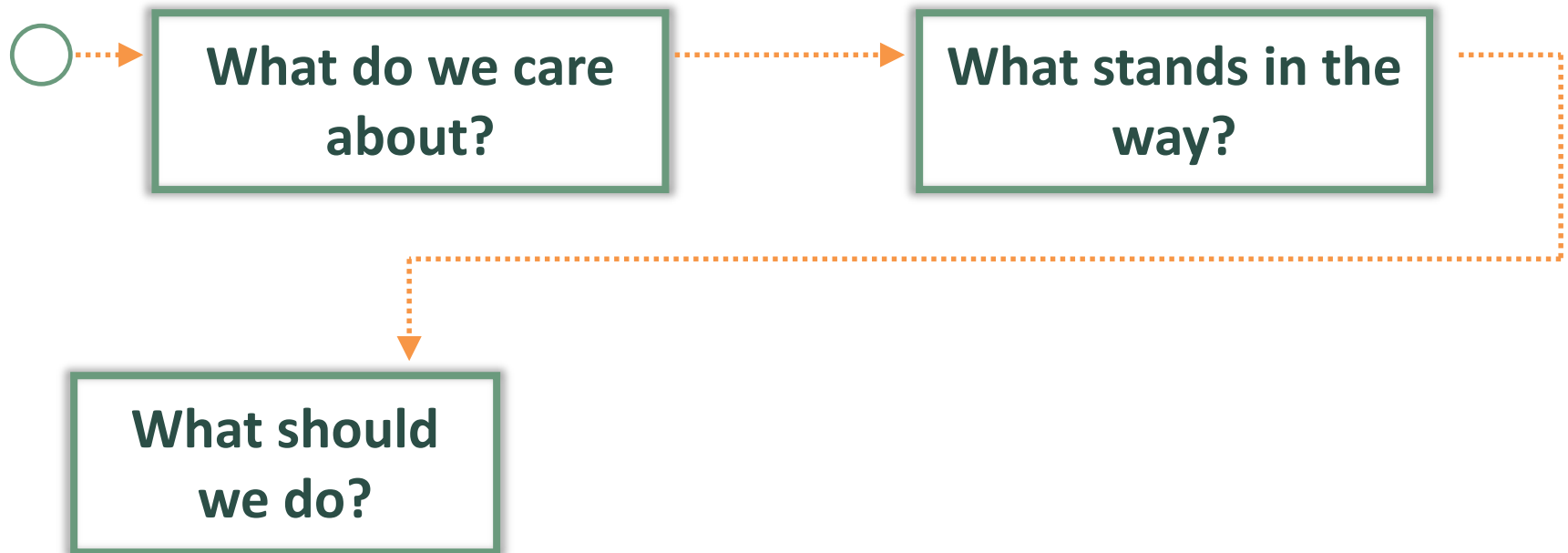

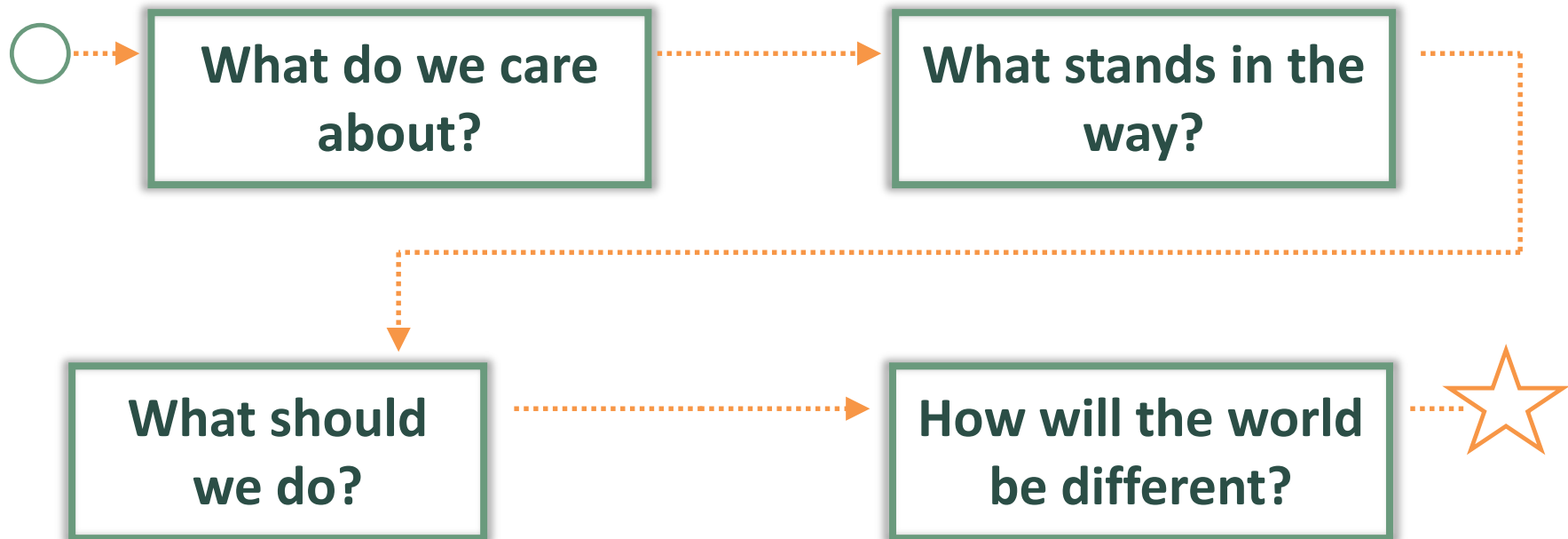

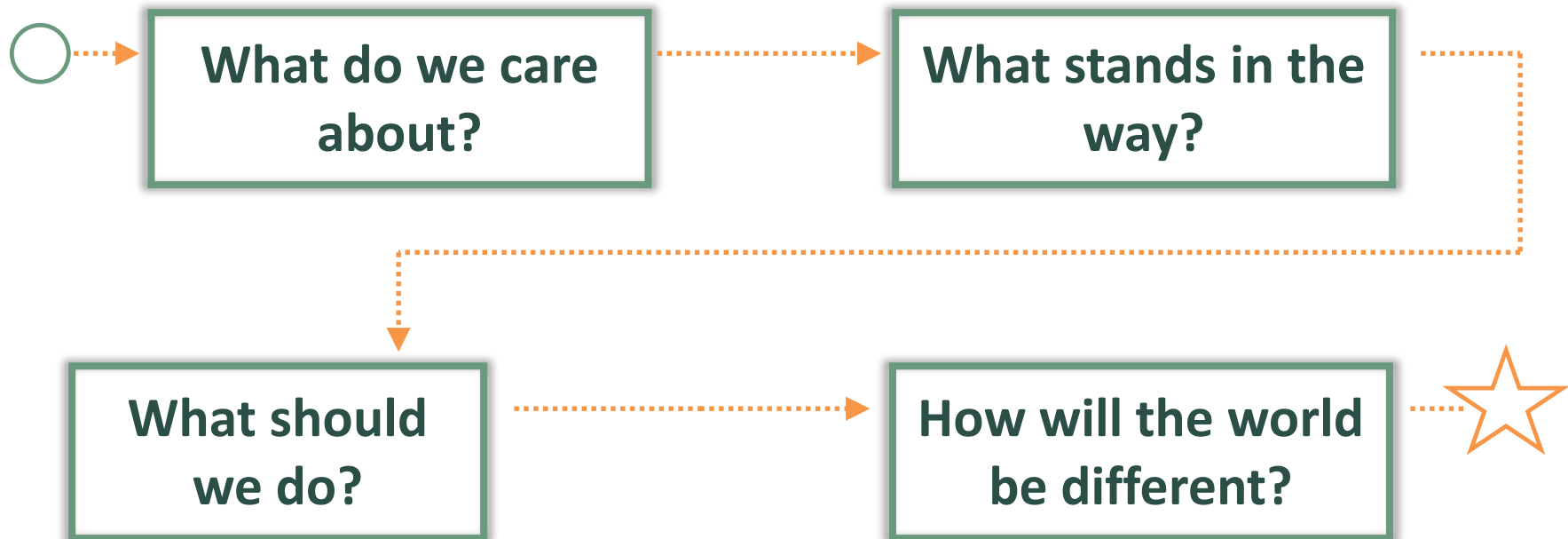

PENINSULA PRIDE

The Peninsula is an amazing place to live, work, and do business. But one of the main roads that links our communities together—El Camino Real—does not match the spirit and high quality of life that make this place great.

El Camino Real needs updating. It passes through the heart of the Peninsula and South Bay, but it does not reflect the vibrant spirit of these communities. The Grand Boulevard initiative aims to change that.



PEOPLE FRIENDLY PLACES

The Grand Boulevard Initiative supports work to make the El Camino Real Corridor more friendly to the people who live and work here: Parents. Kids. Commuters. Homeowners. Local businesses.

El Camino Real improvements are making it safer and easier for people to walk and bike to school or the store, easier for people to get to and from work, and easier for people to live close to where they work and play.

Projects we support help Peninsula residents commute and get around without their cars, making it possible to walk to restaurants, shop locally, and enjoy an all-around healthier lifestyle. Together we are establishing El Camino Real as a people-friendly destination for all of the surrounding communities.

GRAND BOULEVARD INITIATIVE PROJECTS

The Grand Boulevard Initiative supports people friendly places all along the El Camino Real Corridor (which includes the half mile strip of neighborhoods on either side of the road). Cities, landowners, and developers are teaming up to make the El Camino corridor a better place through projects like sidewalk and crosswalk improvements, median beautification, transportation and easier access to buses and trains, improved signs and lighting, and development of homes, shops, and offices close to one another. In line with local styles and local needs, each community is working to make the El Camino Real Corridor a more people friendly place for generations to come.

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El Camino Real Corridor at a Glance


- State Route 82
- 43 miles long, 1 mile wide
- Connects Peninsula downtowns, spanning from Daly City to San Jose
- Bus lines and train stations within walking distance
 - Caltrain: 10 stations within ¼ mile
 - BART — 5 stations within ¼ mile
 - SamTrans and VTA buses
