Purpose Definition

Create a Healthy, Connected and Inclusive San Mateo County

Healthy

The process of promoting and supporting the long-term benefits of physical, community, environmental, mental and organizational well-being.

Connected

The action of bringing people together through personal interaction or another common link established for the advancement of a cohesive community (i.e.: internet).

Inclusive

The practice of including people who might otherwise be excluded or marginalized, such as those with disabilities, lower incomes, or who do not have access to things that promote healthy lifestyles like housing.

Housing Challenges in San Mateo County



Job/Housing Imbalance

- 106,000 new jobs will be added between 2022-2026
- Less than 25,000 units of new housing created
- Of the over 300,000 people who work in the County, 63% live outside the county








- 1) Contact HIP Housing
